DECLARATION OF HAMBURG 2009

We, the Participants at the 3rd session of the Summer Academy,

Having assembled in the Free and Hanseatic City of Hamburg at the seat of the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea, from 26th July to 23rd August, 2009;

Determined to follow the path of excellence set by our predecessors of the first and the second Summer Academy of 2007 and 2008;

Desirous to build upon the strong foundation established by our predecessors in the declarations of Hamburg 2007 and 2008 ;

Having had the honour and the privilege to take part in the 3rd session of the Summer Academy on the topic "Uses and Protection of the Sea - Legal, Economic and Natural Science Perspectives";

Recognizing the immense richness of this program due to its varied, balanced, participative and interactive character involving lectures, workshops, moot court and excursions;

Recognizing the high standards, the expertise, the experience and professionalism of different lecturers;

Welcoming the diversity of the Participants in relation to geographical and ethnic origin and gender as well as their varied professional backgrounds and areas of expertise;

Recognizing the particular support of the International Foundation for the Law of the Sea for the Participants from Developing Countries;

Welcoming also the quality and enriching character of the debates involving the exchange of ideas and the deepening of understanding of many aspects of the law of the sea, maritime law and oceanic affairs;
